We are celebrating the new academic year with some excellent GCSE results from pupils supported by our specialist EAL teachers and in the community language GCSEs.

Our recycling project Re-use, Re-read, Re-wear exceeded its targets. Thanks and well done to all the schools who participated in the workshops and to the pupils who organised and collected so many clothes and books for the project.

A wealth of learning has taken place at Fair Futures and will continue this year. We are now in our third year of providing ESOL lessons for learners from Hong Kong and are planning excursions within the local area for this year.

The Young Asylum Seeker and Refugee group will be learning about democracy in the UK and how to use their voice in the coming months. We will be visiting Parliament in January and are looking forward to seeing the sights in London. Fair Futures is delighted to be one of 5 organisations selected for the GM Regional Care Cooperative Pathfinder — one of only two in the country - which is funding the work on young care-experienced people sharing their views.

The Migration Stories project, which we ran in conjunction with The Derby High School, has now come to an end, but the stories are now live and accessible to all. An exhibition of the project is on 6/7th November!

The Fair Futures website continues to grow. Information about Hate Crime and advice for Ukrainian new arrivals is available alongside educational resources and booking forms for Fair Futures services.

#### **COMMUNITY** LANGUAGE GCSES

Fair Futures has successfully facilitated GCSEs in community languages in schools across our region.

We have worked with 15 schools and given more than 140 pupils the opportunity to gain an additional qualification. Pupils may take an exam in their home language or a language they have taught themselves at home.

Schools that offer this service to pupils are acknowledging the value of being bilingual and validating pupils' home languages. Passing this GCSE also gives students a valuable additional qualification

# Reuse, Re-read, Re-wear



Donations of books and fabric items from the local community were collected over the year in this project funded by R4GM. The items were then sorted for sale, reuse, repurposing or recycling by volunteers as part of a work skills development project. Most of the donated clothes were made available at clothing events which were targeted at marginalised communities in Bury.

Ten events took place in local primary schools which engaged children in learning what happens to waste, the impact on the environment and how we can reduce negative impacts. Reusing and repurposing items were a key focus and children, their schools and families joined in with creative activities to reuse donated books and textiles.
